PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear members, colleagues and friends,

Firstly, I would like to thanks all of you for the trust offered to me as President-Elect since March 2006 and the high number of votes that confirmed me as SOMED President until 2010.

Also on the basis of the frequent e-mail contacts with many of you concerning different issues of our Society, I believe that it is useful to briefly summarize here some key points that characterized my activity as President in the last two years:

- 1) The opening of the SOMED Bank account in Greece in November 2006, managed by the new Society Treasurer, Professor Eugenia Bezirtzoglou, and the transfer to this account of the residual SOMED funds (2587 USD) from the Past-Treasurer Rial Rolfe.
- 2) The efforts made with Eugenia Bezirtzoglou and contributions from other members, to design and regularly update the new Society's website (www.somed.nu) which contains a number of useful information on the Society and its history as well as all issues of the SOMED Newsletter. This electronic, newly designed quarterly Newsletter is reaching again, since March 2007, all Society members as well as more than 500 scientists involved in the field of microbial ecology in health and disease.
- 3) The recovery of SOMED dues for the years 2005 and 2006 from Taylor & Francis (T&F). In fact, T&F as Publishers of the SOMED Official Journal, Microbial Ecology in Health and Disease (MEHD), receives SOMED membership fees (including Journal subscription) and, according to the agreement signed with the Society, should have sent 25 USD/member to the Treasurer at the end of each year. However, only on September 14, 2007, after dozens of emails sent by myself as SOMED President, our Treasurer finally received 2871 USD for the above mentioned years.
- 4) A continuous e-mail exchange and a meeting in Rome last September, with Dr. Häkan Pärup, General Manager of Informa Health (Taylor & Francis Group) to establish new terms and conditions for the 2005-2009 Agreement with SOMED, including the new Student membership categories with (50 EUR) or without (25 EUR) subscription to MEHD, to promote membership of young post-docs. Annual fees for regular and corporate members have been also updated to 60 EUR and 500 EUR, respectively. Informa Health receives annual fees from members and transfers 20 EUR for each

regular or student members and 100 EUR for each corporate member. The remaining money is managed to support MEHD publication. Further, a new strategy to relaunch MEHD, including the Journal ranking on the basis of its Impact Factor and the appointment of a larger Editorial Board, has been planned.

5) A recruitment campaign of new SOMED members and of "dormant" former members. In fact, out of the 224 regularly paying SOMED members in 1994, when Dr. Paola Mastrantonio and I organized the XIX SOMED Meeting in Rome, only about 50 members have paid their annual fees in the years 2005 and 2006. This dramatic drop in the number of members have also corresponded to a limited participation (no more than 100 attendees) to the SOMED meetings organized in recent years.

Since I strongly believe that a well organized annual meeting, attracting a large number of participants, is pivotal for a scientific Society, I did my best for the success of the last Congress in Rome to which more than 400 researchers and clinicians have participated as a result of the joint efforts with Professor Lucio Capurso, President of the IV Probiotics, Prebiotics & New Foods. The numerous congratulation letters received after the Congress tell me that we can hope in a significant increase in the number of SOMED members in the near future: in fact, on April 2008 we have already reached a total of 100 applicants.

6) A fund-raising campaign for both the Society and its official Journal MEHD started early in 2008 to recruit sponsoring Companies. In particular, a letter offering options to support the Journal as Platinum, Gold or Silver sponsors with different annual donations and benefits has been addressed to about 20 European Companies. So far we obtained positive reply from 2 companies, one Gold Sponsor (Danone) and one Silver Sponsor (AAT), but I'm optimistic about the next future.

I rely on your active collaboration in this fund-raising campaign and I hope to receive from all of you suggestions and comments on my activity as SOMED President as well as contributions and information to be included in the SOMED Newsletter.

I hope to see you all in Djurönäset.


